Chairman Charles Thacker spoke to Edward Cope, whom is wanting to build a road on his property. Chairman Thacker stated he told Cope it had to have four (4) inches of gravel and two (2) inches of blacktop. Mr. Cope was not present today and no action was taken.

LONGTOWN ROAD:

Commissioner Palmer stated driving Longtown Road is like driving on a wash board. Jones stated they used graders, new operators, and new truck drivers.
