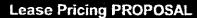

CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION AND HAWKINS COUNTY

This Contract, by and between the State of Tennessee, **FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION**, hereinafter referred to as the "State" and **HAWKINS COUNTY**, hereinafter referred to as the "Procuring Party," is for the provision of Geographic Information System (GIS) digital base map data, as further defined in the "SCOPE OF SERVICES."

A. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

A.1. The State will provide the Procuring Party the following products as detailed in the Statewide GIS Base Mapping Program Technical Specifications, which are hereby incorporated by reference. These shall consist of the acquisition of aerial photography and supporting control information for the production of digital ortho images, and associated digital terrain models delivered on CD ROM disks or other suitable media. The specific products to be produced are detailed in the following table, and the spatial extent of these products are described in the referenced attachment(s):

A.2 <u>Schedule</u>: The data products detailed in Paragraph A.1 shall be delivered to the Procuring Party according to a mutually agreed to schedule that shall be developed and agreed to within 60 days of the execution of this contract. The schedule shall be the basis for determining Milestone product delivery dates.

B. <u>CONTRACT TERM</u>:

- B.1. Contract Term. This Contract shall be effective for the period commencing on **June 1, 2007** and ending on **May 31, 2008**.
- B.2. <u>Term Extension</u>. The parties of this Contract reserve the right to extend the Contract for an additional period or periods of time representing increments of no more than one year and a total contract term of no more than five (5) years, provided that such an extension of the contract term is effected prior to the current, contract expiration date through an amendment to the Contract.

C. PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- C.1. The total fee due the State under this contract shall be Thirty One Thousand One Hundred Thirty Three dollars (\$31,133.00). The State shall invoice the Procuring Party according to the milestone (product delivery) schedule developed in accordance with paragraph A.2. of this contract.
- C.2. The Procuring Party shall pay the State after receiving satisfactory data products and within 90 days of receipt of an invoice, based upon the following unit rates for Basic Products.

D. STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- D.1. Required Approvals. The State is not bound by this Contract or any amendment thereof until it is approved by the appropriate State officials in accordance with applicable Tennessee State laws and regulations.
- D.2. <u>Modification and Amendment</u>. This Contract may be modified only by a written amendment executed by all parties hereto and approved by the appropriate Tennessee State officials in accordance with applicable Tennessee State laws and regulations.
- D.3. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. The Contract may be terminated by either party by giving written notice to the other, at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of termination. Said termination shall not be deemed a Breach of Contract by the State. Should the State exercise this provision, the State shall have no liability to the Procuring Party. Should either the State or the Procuring Party exercise this provision, the Procuring Party shall be required to compensate the State for satisfactory, authorized services completed as of the termination date and shall have no liability to the State except for those units of service which can be effectively used by the Procuring Party. The final decision, as to what these units of service are, shall be determined by the State. In the event of disagreement, the Procuring Party may file a claim with the Tennessee Claims Commission in order to seek redress.

Upon such termination, the Procuring Party shall have no right to any actual general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount.

- D.4. <u>Termination for Cause</u>. If the Procuring Party fails to properly perform or fulfill its obligations under this Contract in a timely or proper manner or violates any terms of this Contract, the State shall have the right to immediately terminate the Contract. The Procuring Party shall compensate the State for completed services.
- D.5. <u>Subcontracting</u>. Neither the Procuring Party nor the State shall assign this Contract or enter into a subcontract for any of the services performed under this Contract without obtaining the prior written approval of the other. If such subcontracts are approved, they shall contain, at a minimum, sections of this Contract below pertaining to "Conflicts of Interest," "Nondiscrimination," and "Records" (as identified by the section headings).
- D.6. Conflicts of Interest. The Procuring Party warrants that no amount shall be paid directly or indirectly to an employee or official of the State of Tennessee as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as an officer, agent, employee, subcontractor, or consultant to the Procuring Party in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Contract other than as required by Section A. of this Contract.
- D.7. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. The State and the Procuring Party hereby agree, warrant, and assure that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Contract or in the employment practices of the State or

All instructions, notices, consents, demands, or other communications shall be considered effectively given as of the day of delivery; as of the date specified for overnight courier service delivery; as of three (3) business days after the date of mailing; or on the day the facsimile transmission is received mechanically by the telefax machine at the receiving location and receipt is verbally confirmed by the sender if prior to 4:30 p.m. CST. Any communication by facsimile transmission shall also be sent by United States mail on the same date of the facsimile transmission.

E.3. Confidentiality of Records. Strict standards of confidentiality of records shall be maintained in accordance with the law. All material and information, regardless of form, medium or method of communication, provided to the Procuring Party by the State or acquired by the Procuring Party on behalf of the State shall be regarded as confidential information in accordance with the provisions of State law and ethical standards and shall not be disclosed, and all necessary steps shall be taken by the Procuring Party to safeguard the confidentiality of such material or information in conformance with State law and ethical standards.

The Procuring Party will be deemed to have satisfied its obligations under this section by exercising the same level of care to preserve the confidentiality of the State's information as the Procuring Party exercises to protect its own confidential information so long as such standard of care does not violate the applicable provisions of the first paragraph of this section.

The Procuring Party's obligations under this section do not apply to information in the public domain; entering the public domain but not from a breach by the Procuring Party of this Contract; previously possessed by the Procuring Party without written obligations to the State to protect it; acquired by the Procuring Party without written restrictions against disclosure from a third party which, to the Procuring Party's knowledge, is free to disclose the information; independently developed by the Procuring Party without the use of the State's information; or, disclosed by the State to others without restrictions against disclosure.

It is expressly understood and agreed the obligations set forth in this section shall survive the termination of this Contract.

E.4. Ownership of data products: Ownership of the Basic Data Products that are provided to the Procuring Party under this contract shall be jointly held by the State and Procuring Party in an amount commensurate with the investment by each party. Specifically, the total to the State for production of these Basic Data products is One Hundred Twenty Four Thousand Five Hundred Thirty Two dollars (\$124,532). The Procuring Party's obligation of Thirty One Thousand One Hundred Thirty Three dollars (\$31,133) represents 25% of this total. The State's obligation shall be Ninety Three Thousand Three Hundred Ninety Nine dollars (\$93,399) which represents 75% of the total basic products.

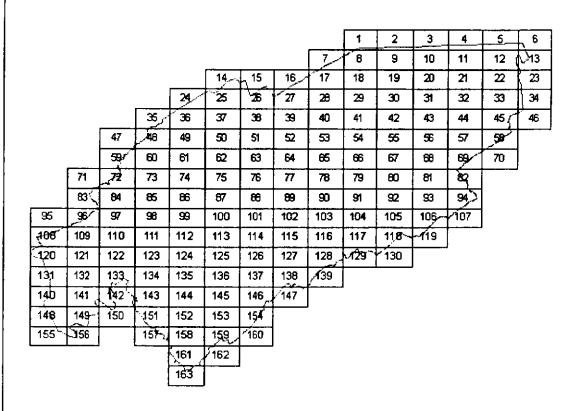
